Dear TRICARE Beneficiary:

Our records indicate you may be taking a prescription drug(s) that will be moving to a special non-formulary status, meaning you will pay 100 percent of the cost of the drug if you get it from a retail network pharmacy. This is happening because the law requires drug companies to provide a discount price to the Department of Defense when beneficiaries use retail pharmacies. When a drug company does not agree in writing to provide a discount, TRICARE is required to place the drug in a non-formulary status and cannot offer it at retail network pharmacies without prior authorization.

The attached page lists all medications affected by this change, as well as the date the change occurs. The page has other drug options for you and your doctor to consider. To avoid paying the full cost for your drug(s), you may:

1. Switch to TRICARE Pharmacy Home Delivery. Home Delivery is a convenient and cost-effective way to get your drug; you will pay the non-formulary (Tier 3) cost-share for a 90-day supply. To learn more, visit www.tricare.mil/homedelivery.
2. Take the attached page to your doctor to discuss switching to a formulary drug. The formulary options listed are available at retail network pharmacies.
3. If your doctor feels it is necessary for you to continue receiving your drug(s) and it is best for you to get it from a retail network pharmacy, your doctor may call the TRICARE Pharmacy contractor, Express Scripts, Inc., at (866) 684-4488 to request prior authorization. If approved, you will pay the non-formulary (Tier 3) cost-share for a 30-day supply.

Dear TRICARE Beneficiary:

Our records indicate you may be taking a prescription drug(s) that will be moving to a special non-formulary status, meaning you will pay 100 percent of the cost of the drug if you get it from a retail network pharmacy. This is happening because the law requires drug companies to provide a discount price to the Department of Defense when beneficiaries use retail pharmacies. When a drug company does not agree in writing to provide a discount, TRICARE is required to place the drug in a non-formulary status and cannot offer it at retail network pharmacies without prior authorization.

The attached page lists all medications affected by this change, as well as the date the change occurs. The page has other drug options for you and your doctor to consider. To avoid paying the full cost for your drug(s), you may:

1. Switch to TRICARE Pharmacy Home Delivery. Home Delivery is a convenient and cost-effective way to get your drug; you will pay the non-formulary (Tier 3) cost-share for a 90-day supply. To learn more, visit www.tricare.mil/homedelivery.
2. Take the attached page to your doctor to discuss switching to a formulary drug. The formulary options listed are available at retail network pharmacies.
3. If your doctor feels it is necessary for you to continue receiving your drug(s) and it is best for you to get it from a retail network pharmacy, your doctor may call the TRICARE Pharmacy contractor, Express Scripts, Inc., at (866) 684-4488 to request prior authorization. If approved, you will pay the non-formulary (Tier 3) cost-share for a 30-day supply.
